PRESIDENT

My third season as President is almost at an end and I am sitting here in front of the computer with so much to say, but conscious of the fact that sometimes my reports get a bit too long. This year I am going to try to be a bit more concise. Well I did say try!

To all members, whether you have donated one hour of your time across your whole membership, or 100 hours every season, you deserve to be thanked for your effort. Volunteering isn't easy especially with the competition from other areas for our time. In the not too distant past it seemed to be easier however. I have read numerous Annual Reports lately, and have noticed many Presidents and Club Captains writing about members not showing up for patrols and letting down their mates right back in the 40's, 50's, 60's, 70's you get the picture – it has always happened. I am not saying that it's right but every hour donated should be celebrated and thank-yous given.

What really hurts is when someone commits to helping and does not - that lets the team down as we rely on you to do what you have promised. We have numerous options for communicating these days, so do the right thing and either stick to your promises or tell someone, "Hey I cannot make it today, tomorrow or at all this season," but please just tell us.

Please see below. I have copied this mantra from an old report. It used to get mentioned a lot and, while it makes me smile, it is very true. I would like to think that we have moved on from this position and can value everyone's input, however the one big take home for me has always been "try to put in above and beyond just turning up and you will generally get personal satisfaction from the effort. Simple but effective.

That's the serious bit over for now.

We started the season a bit under-strength but rolled on till we got to a bit of a crisis point. Alex, our Club Captain, and Dave, our Director Of Lifesaving, called a meeting, and, well done to everyone, you responded to the call. We had lots of people show up and we've learnt how to run the session better next time. We have since received separate and ongoing feedback but, more importantly, from that moment onwards our patrol strength has been generally fantastic on the beaches.

From the AGM we knew that it would be a season of changes, we had a new Club Captain and Vice Captain, new Administrator, new Surf Sports Director, new CHD, new Membership Director, IRB team manager and coaches plus some vacant roles carried over. It is easy to blame others when things don't seem to be going well but at the end of the day the vast majority are volunteers just doing the best they can. The Club is always grateful for anyone who steps up to say they will help with something and thankfully people always do step up.

Also just a quick mention of the support from Bay FM. Ted, Jacko and the team, have given us a heap of mentions - support for our events, membership drive and even promoted community support for our Aussie Titles workforce.

Whilst on that sort of topic, thank you to Mike Stone for organising a workforce for the Staddie Salute. Present were Moscos, Keith Weinert, Calan Lovitt, Tony Langenberg, Michael White, Pauline Knowles, Don Jackson, Jacko's nephew Paul Kimmich, myself, Ciaran Smith, Adrian Marriott, Sarah Sammut and the new Canadian Bronzies.

This was a season without a Miss Summer Surf Girl, so the season tends to be more challenging on the income level, I am pleased to say that House to House, Prawns at the Point 2019 and Aussie Titles workforce opportunities all presented themselves and, as usual, the Club excelled and pulled in those much needed funds. We will have separate reports on those events a little further on.

There are a series of graphs and tables from SLSQ shown later in this report which display the general membership stats for our Club and how we have been going over consecutive seasons. Please note that our Club is going quite well against the trends seen in many other clubs BUT we cannot afford to be complacent. If you follow the logic through on the member retention, we are turning over 100% of the gross membership base every 4 years because of 25% of members are lost every year. As I said, most other clubs have it far worse than this, but we also know that our core of members is relatively strong though we do need to get the basics right and aim higher for better member retention.

These results mostly stem from the traction the Club

is gaining from the JAC programs that Matthew Robinson, Sharon Brennan, Jason Rasmussen and Pete Josefski and the rest of JA team have put together. Equally important is the cross-over moving from the juniors to seniors. Our thanks goes to the JAC team for their excellent results and also to those parents such as Michael Firman, Eddie Retimana and Jason Rasmussen who thought innovatively and organised the family camp to enable greater integration of the juniors into the Club.

Regrettably, we had our first Club Judiciary Committee meetings in several years this season. These were necessary to reinforce the discipline required in the Club. Mostly our members have been doing the right thing and this is thanks to the sound day to day management of our Club Captain, Alex, and his Vice Captains, Lachy and Moscos, along with mentoring from Dave Westby and Cal.

Your Club continues to uphold its 71 year old tradition of keeping the beaches of North Stradbroke Island safe for all beachgoers.

I would like to take the opportunity to pass on my thanks and convey many thank-yous on the behalf of all members.

We understand you need to focus your efforts elsewhere and, while we wish you all the best, we hope to see you either on patrol or just enjoying a cold ale at the bar or on the Moreton trip, sometime in the

future. It really is time to step back and enjoy.

Thank you also to Karen Bodger, our Secretary, you had a very big year with work, Club, grandbabies, travel and a new Club Administrator. As a Club we thank you for your efforts as Secretary, and, as I mentioned previously, our members are really well represented by your advocacy.

Our Club Captain, Alex Langenberg, has performed well in his first year in role of Club Captain. Thank you Alex. I am sure you would all agree that Lachlan L'Barrow and Mick Stone have been excellent Vice Captains and I want to recognise their efforts in pulling the Club together on their respective weekends. The role of Captain is demanding, and sometimes a thankless task, so Alex and crew, a big thank you from the Club.

What a great effort from several people to keep the patrol team fed.

To Merv Meares and John McInnes thank you also for your solid efforts around the Club and at Aussie Titles.

Members: Thank you to the members who give their time and paid the cost of attending the Club when you patrolled, or trained or helped out. You are the strength of the Club and this enables us to provide the lifesaving and other activities around the club - food, fundraising, Surf Girl, Club maintenance, training or school groups – the list goes on. This is what our Club is all about. Calan Lovit, thank you for your long standing contribution and support of the Club and its members.

Captains: I would like to recognise all of our Patrol Captains for their efforts this season. It can be a tricky job organising your teams and keeping them all focussed, showing up and doing the job. Well done and thank-you!

This season we had 212 members complete a combined 8304 patrol hours. Last season, remarkably, we had 212 members complete a combined 9062

patrol hours and this is terrific when you consider the effort involved in getting to a patrol from the mainland - it adds an extra 2 to 4 hours just to attend to your patrol. So thank-you for the commitment and investment in yourself and the Club. What this also tells us is that last season members were doing slightly more hours on average, 43 hours per member compared to 39 hours per member this season.

Training: I think everyone would agree that Don Stevenson works tirelessly in his role as Director of Training. Thanks to Don and the team of trainers and assessors for your efforts across the season and offseason, your efforts are amazing on behalf of the Club. **Competition:** To Mike Stone as Director of Surf Sports and all Club members who compete on behalf of the Club, thank you for your exceptional efforts. The IRB competition season has just started, so best of luck to the team and the pool rescue teams flying our Club colours. I am sure Moscos will mention our own Club efforts but I will give an honourable to Fraser Toon, Callum Brennan, Patrick, Tammy and Johnny Hagan. Club Assets: The building itself was once again very challenging from a maintenance perspective. This season it was those pesky termites which everyone on the island is concerned about. They have done a good job replacing the deck and retiling and it all looks better than ever. We have learned a lot and have taken steps to make the lower shed more visible to inspection and also treated the area. Once again the Old Boys have dug deep and transferred a massive amount of money to the Club to help cover the cost involved.

We also have had loads of damage to Thunderbird 1, so off to the smash repairers and insurers it goes. Guys, I knows it's hard and I know no-one sets out to damage our vehicles, but please try to watch out for our buses they seem to attract loads of damage.

To the Building Committee – thank-you to the whole committee, particularly Andy Pryor, Mike Stone and Dave Westby, for the energy and effort you have put into the Committee and into these repairs and issues. Thank-you to Chad for an excellent tiling job and huge thanks to Peter Bayard for organising a lot of the day to day tasks on this project, keeping us on track and, more importantly, for the free tiles sourced through your contacts. Thank-you, also, to Greg Sills at DIY Tiles for your most generous support.

During his time as CHD, Peter Burke organised a lot to do with the roof replacement. Thanks, Peter, and there will be more on this next season as we move into the next chapter of the Surf Club roof.

Surf Girl: (a big grin on our faces) We have a Surf Girl for next season – watch this space next year!!!

Old Boys: Thank you to the Old Boys for sponsoring the Prawns at the Point and also your major support of the repairs to the deck and the Club working bee.

Tony will cover this further in his report on the finances for the Club.

As a final wrap up on the Old Boys, I want to call out how important it is to see these gentlemen at the Aussies Titles workforce, they seem to get unlimited energy when they go to Aussies.

Finance and fundraising: Amanda Lawson is no longer our Finance Director but that did not stop her from helping us out organising the Club Calendar together with Dianne Stevenson. She also organised all details of the House to House (SOS) appeal and appears to do this effortlessly. Thanks again to Julie Gillis for the use of her house and to the Old Boys for their support and cooking of the BBQ.

The team did really well with the grants this season and continues to submit them as I write this report. TREASURER



Have you ever blown up an IRB with a foot pump?

It takes a long time to fill and only moments to empty with a simple twist of a valve.

The club's bank balances are the same – Hard to fill but easy to empty.

On this analogy I proudly present to you the 2018/19 season Treasurers Report.

Our full and detailed financials accompany this annual report. They provide an accounting view of our surf club world which, is highly valuable, yet daunting for those not used to so many figures.

Our club has always focused on the cash in the bank. This is a very easy and particle method of measuring the financial strength of our club as generally speaking our assets are either non saleable (our clubhouse as an example) or depreciate rapidly.

Our proud club is made up of 4 areas, maybe not technically but in reality:

- Surf Club
- Junior Activities
- Old Boys
- Supporters Club

This diversity combined with our unique environment provides both challenges and opportunities. The challenges being obvious from a financial viewpoint in that our expenses are generally exacerbated, and income opportunity reduced due to lack of exposure and public traffic. Our opportunities on the other hand, again referring financially, are generally labour intensive providing genuine environments for personal and team growth

In short, we have always had to work hard for our money, respect the things we own and spend consciously to ensure we achieve the best value for money. See the summary of our bank balances (next column) in comparison to last season. Overall you see a reduction of 8.5% in these balances. On the surface this would appear to be negative and in relation to the earlier statements they are however there are some definite silver linings.

Expenses Summary

To summarise our expenses for the year I am proud to acknowledge we controlled them relatively well. It is important to remember that saving money on any expenses has the same effect as raising valuable money. All members can play their part. It is matter of doing the little things which will all add up.

Capital Expenditure

Capital expenditure relates to assets we purchase.

These include items such as IRB's, Motors, Vehicles, Boards and this year an ice machine.

The club purchased two IRB's this season from funds received in previous years.

Purchasing of items is generally only done when we have a grant to off set the costs.

Clubhouse Maintenance

Our precious facility takes a lot of upkeep. Unfortunately, this year we got hit with termites with a cost of repairs around \$37,000 in the financial year. The total will be closer to \$40,000.

In previous years we have had the luxury of Clubhouse Hire covering a fair amount of our maintenance. However, this season the net amount of income from hire was down \$28,000.

The unfortunate part to this year's expenditure is that it is repairs only with no improvements. In past years the bar toilets and honour boards made the clubhouse a more enjoyable place.

As lifesavers we occupy the building for a relatively small amount of time. It is important we seek opportunities to grow income from this amazing location whilst we are not using it.

Administration

The professionalism of Surf Life Saving is a credit to the greater organisation. It is an expanding organisation that continues to evolve providing greater services for the public and greater opportunities for the members who volunteer their precious time.

Our club also continues to expand with record membership numbers (particularly in JA), increased fundraising demands, training courses and opportunities for our members to develop within the organisation. Our fine volunteers have increased workloads which has for some time been overflowing into paid administration. The cost of administration continues to climb. This is by no means reflective of the work of our valued paid employees, it is purely a by-

product of the before mentioned advantages.

I would like to reiterate though as it is a major expense to our club that moving forward, we need to ensure we embrace change and particularly technology to ensure we achieve good value for money

Insurance

Another huge cost at close to \$40,000. However, we have a large number of assets (including our members) to protect. This risk transfer is for the long-term protection of our club. Sometimes it is a little too well used when it comes to our vehicles

Competition

The development of our members through competition and training can never be understated. There is no point in having all this great equipment if we have no one to use. Competition is also an important part of a complete members development. At a total cost of \$27,000 it is money well spent as both activities are reward for elite volunteerism.

Income Summary

Our income was down this season. This can be attributed to several key areas including clubhouse hire and no surf girl activity.

Grants and Donations

Again, our grants are primarily used to purchase equipment. The major grants we were afforded this year were:

- VMR \$23,090 Used to offset administration costs
- Port of Brisbane \$15,000
- Sibelco \$15,000 Clubhouse repairs
- Various other smaller grants totally over \$15,000

We have traditionally received \$20,000 from the Redland City Council. This is progressing through the council however by the end of financial year we had not received this payment.

All up we received in excess of \$80,000 in donations. A major thank you to:

- Supporters Club \$35,000
- Old Boys \$30,700

The remainder are smaller amounts (and don't include JA as I will let Emu do that). Donations from Prawns @ the Point are included as well.

Member Fundraising

We have four major fundraising events throughout the year. Fundraising is an integral part of what we do and vital to keep our club going. Some of these events have been icons that we can continue to build upon:

- House to House Collection \$32,000
- Aussie Titles \$17,300
- Prawns @ the Point \$12,000*
- Calendar Sales \$300

Prawns @ the Point - Old Boys agreed to sponsor for \$4,000 but put that money into their \$30,000 donation

These don't include competition team fundraising or JA Fundraising events.

Membership Fees

Membership fees exceed \$50,000 and although this looks like a significant sum they are quickly offset by administration and insurance costs. Our membership numbers continue to grow, particularly at JA Level.

Clubhouse Hire

As noted in the expenses Clubhouse Hire Income was significantly down this season. It is imperative we use this asset to assist with our fundraising ventures.

Overall, with the inclusion of Aussie Titles our income was quite good. Next season we will not have the luxury of the same level of donation from the Supporters Club nor the Old Boys and this needs to be factored in.

Of course, we can continue to build on a number of our mainstream activities with an aim to increase value of already popular events.

Thank You's

After seven seasons it is time for me to hang up the calculator and hand over to another member who will come in with renewed vigour and ideas.

Firstly, to Sean, Karen, Alex and Keith as the current Executive – It has been a pleasure to work with you all over the past number of seasons. Granted we have not always agreed but seem to find a way to work it for the betterment of the club.

To other Management Committee members both past and present again my sincerest thanks. There are so many positive ideas floating around it would be great to see them all executed.

Heidi Roscher continues to be the unsung hero of the Treasury department. Many people do not know or see the work Heids does in the background which saves the club thousands of dollars each and every year. She completes the role with humility, and I would not been able to do the past seven years without her valuable assistance. Thanks again Heids.

Peter Josefski and Dave Finter - You both took on challenging roles in the JA and Old Boys respectively. Well done on taking on the responsibility with great enthusiasm. Your assistance has been invaluable for the overall club.

Ben Whibley and Nat May - Thanks crew – You've been a great help.

To my good mates - Emu, Merv, McInnes, John Bristow and Sean – I appreciate your advice and guidance. There a few others who fit in the category......

We have a great club, which is in great financial position, with plenty of gear and a strong membership base. Looking back at the start of my period as Treasurer the clubs bank balance was \$365k - It is now



20% higher. In no way do I take credit for this but using it as a yardstick it suggests we have all the successful ingredients to continue to prosper and continue the work of members who have come before us. Let's take the opportunity to make the next five years even grander than the last five years.


Thank you to Dave for being MC yet again and to Rick for his auctioning skills. Thanks, too, to Pauline for the 12 months of planning for the day.

A former Palm Beach life saver – Greg Batchelor, was President, George Hill Jnr was Captain for the third year. Other position holders which are still associated with the club included Ian

Ames (Treasurer & Vice President), Julie Keen (Assistant Secretary), Mike Stone (Clubhouse Director & Assist Chief Instructor), Shane Modini (Gear Steward & Assist Truck Officer), Jeff Daley (First Aid Officer & Carnival Manager), Darren Woodward (Power Craft Officer), Greg Keen (Radio Officer & Branch Delegate) and Matthew Stevenson (Assist Radio Officer).

Simon Johnstone and Sharon Wright (Brennan) were last year Nippers.

Surf Girl was school girl Helen Commons who along with her assistants in fundraising - George Hill and

Darren Woodward raised a club record \$9,650.

Proficient Members included 27 Seniors, 18 Juniors and 7 Cadets however



the second half of the season saw a big drop in Senior members attending the Point causing the Captain major concerns – at this stage there was no Patrol Roster and patrols were made up of whoever came over for the weekend. The Captain would introduce a Patrol Roster the following season to ensure numbers.

Gary Terrell was awarded the 15th Life Membership – a very popular choice and thoroughly deserved.

There were 56 rescues of which 29 were carried out by IRB crews.

There were 135 minor and 25 major first aid cases.

Club Expenditure was \$109,600 and Income \$103,600. Main income items included state government subsidy \$16,000, Surf Girl \$9,650, Redland Shire Council \$8,000. The Nipper's section of our club was 20 years old and included 81 boys and 49 girls and a willing band of





Old Boys Association Treasurer Peter Barnes – a big help to myself as Club Treasurer, was shot in the face in a hold up at the Wynnum bank where he worked. He survived but was blinded and suffered facial injuries – a shocking crime to a fantastic club member.

Carnival wise the club performed very strongly in many areas including winning the Branch Patrol Competition held on our home beach then a second in the state. We also won the Branch Patrol Efficiency competition

which earned us a new IRB motor.



First Aid wise Jeff and I got 2nd in the Branch, won the State and got 3rd in the Australian. Very pleasing was the results of our two Junior Teams – Rhonda Bostock & Matthew Robinson won the Branch and got 2nd in the State, and Matthew Stevenson & Richard Black got 2nd in the Branch

and 4th in the State.

The IRB teams scored well at the Branch IRB titles held at the Point with 3 firsts, 1 second and eight thirds.

In Club Championships the Open winner was Jeff Daley who also won the Senior Champion, Matthew Robinson was Junior Champion and T. Kite was the Cadet Champion.

LIFE MEMBER MICHAEL 'MOSCOS' STONE

Life membership is the Club's highest honour awarded to those who have distinguished themselves by providing extraordinary and conspicuous service to our Club.

Mike 'Moscos' Stone is a person who typifies the motto of the surf lifesaving movement "Vigilance and Service".

Moscos joined the Club in October 1971. Thus began an association with Point Lookout Surf Life Saving Club which has spanned more than 45 years.

His long association with the Club has taken many forms over the years but on the whole you can see a steady increase in his commitment and involvement and currently Moscos is a fixture at the Club, it seems like he's there 24/7.

Moscos been a stalwart of our Club on many levels – whether its covering patrols, administration, building maintenance, the day to day running of the Club, housing and feeding our members, lifesaving support, examinations and training, competition, nipper education, attending fundraising events - he is always there.

Though he would prefer not to be known as CHD for the Club, he is 'that' person having served as CHD on more occasions than anyone else in the Club. He has excelled in that role, but has also taken on many other roles within our Club. Commitment to a Management position means that you inherit the duties that come with it, attendance at meetings, fiduciary obligations, you are automatically included in several committees, and on top of this he consistently volunteers to do more in Patrol Captain and Club Vice Captain roles. Roles carried out with passion and enthusiasm.

Patrols are at the foundation of the surf lifesaving movement - it is why we exist and since gaining his Bronze Medallion in the late 70's, Moscos has completed just over 2,000 patrol hours (at the completion of the 2017/18 season) with the Club. Even in the current days of better access to the island and patrolling two beaches, this is still to be seen as an outstanding effort. Moscos is still an active patrolling member for our Club, and is taking on new roles and sharing his knowledge and expertise to members both new and old.

Our motto of Vigilance and Service is strong with Moscos and he exemplifies this in his approach to lifesaving in general and in his focus on the beach and in keeping the Stradbroke Island beaches a safe place to be.

In 2013 he received his 30 year Long Service Award medal and in 2016, Moscos gained his 20 year National Patrol Award,

Along the way he has obtained his Gold Medallion in Advanced Lifesaving and Silver Medallions in Life Support, IRB Driver, Beach Management and Patrol Captain's Award in the 2004/2005 season.

Moscos has contributed numerous hours to Operations Support Services with his RWC patrols at Point Lookout, and continues these patrols on a regular basis.

Moscos started taking on positions within our Club in the 1980/1981 season taking on the role of Chief Instructor.

From there he has held the position of Club House Director for 8 seasons has served on multiple Committees over numerous years with his major impact being on the Building committee. Moscos has chaired the Building Committee for several years, and has been involved in many projects over his time on this committee working with a variety of Presidents. Alongside this, Moscos brings two very useful skills sets to our Club. As a qualified painter and pest controller Moscos is seen at the forefront of Club clean-up weekends and building projects ensuring that our clubhouse facilities are well maintained and safe to use.

He is an Instructor in the Bronze Medallion, Advanced Resuscitation, IRB Drivers and radio and has taken numerous squads through for these awards. He is an Assessor for the Bronze Medallion award, Resuscitation and IRB – thus making sure that our Club members have been trained to a suitable standard. He is a willing participant at many of the different camps that are run at the Club. 

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (Qld). The Committee has determined that the Association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Plant and Equipment

Plant and equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the remaining life of the lease.

(b) Income Tax

The Association is a not for profit which is exempt from Income Tax

(c) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

(d) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the entity reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable ameu is of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to seall and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

(e) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

(f) Revenue and Other Income

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant which must be satisfied before it is eligible to receive the contribution, the recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(h) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the statement of framcial position.

(j) Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

(k) Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.
