our members, to be there to volunteer your valuable time.


On behalf of our bathing public – thank you to all Club members for your support and volunteering spirit.

The Treasurer is responsible for empowering the committee to manage the financial affairs of the club. This is for protection of the club's cash, assets and the volunteers who handle them, ensuring the collection of all revenues

and payment of all financial obligations.

The Treasurer must also ensure that all financial transactions are recorded in the club's accounts and producing the club's financial reports for presentation to the committee, the members at the AGM, as well as complying with all financial reporting obligations contained in the club rules and the Incorporated Associations legislation.

This season started with a changing of the guard from Tony Dodd to Len Stone as Treasurer, unfortunately due to work commitments Len was unable to complete the season, the committee and I thank Len for volunteering for the role and acknowledge the time spent understanding the surf club accounts and operations. With Len stepping down during the season I stepped into the role of Treasurer again, having been Assistant Treasurer for some 7 seasons.

This year I converted the back office accounting system from Quickbooks to Xero. This has been a welcome change and has created efficiencies for those contributing to the accounts, I can't get far into this report with thanking Pete Josefski as JAC Treasurer, Nadene Kugler as Assistant Treasurer and Nat May, who as Administrator has refined the process to ensure our supporters and suppliers are entered in Xero for prompt payment.

The surf club started the season with strong cash balances, each and every season the club costs \$500k-\$600k to operate. This season saw our highest expenditure yet with total of \$628,000.

This season our income was similar to previous, our major sources of income being Fundraising of \$150,000, Club functions and activities \$140,000 and Grant funding of \$60,000, a 50% reduction from last season.

Without our sponsors this club would not operate as it does, we are forever grateful to our wonderful

sponsors each and every year, there are too many to call out individually, but a couple of special thanks to Sealink, Redland City Council, QFES, The Wylie Foundation, Port of Brisbane, Redlands Foundation and many many more. Thank you for continuing to support the lifesaving operations of the club, we are always indebted.

Our club relies heavily on fundraising, which in turn relies upon members volunteering their time to pound the pavement, serve people at Prawns, conduct raffles, BBQ's and take on the massive task of Surf Girl. This year I would like to acknowledge the outstanding efforts of Ann-Sophie as Surf Girl, although the end of the season stalled rather suddenly with COVID-19 and lockdowns, you contributed over \$60,000 into the fundraising income of the club. Ann-Sophie and her committee should be proud of their efforts, dedication and new memories created.

A breakdown of our expenditure this season shows that everything is costing us a little more, club functions and activities were \$126,000 repairs and maintenance on our clubhouse was \$45,000, Insurance expenses were \$44,000, club clothing was \$55,000.

Our Administrative costs including our Administrator and Professional costs were nearly \$70,000 albeit worth every cent. Nat May has supported me this season completely, nothing is ever too much trouble and she brings a smile and professionalism to the club, Nat – we are lucky to have you, thank you for being our Administrator.

It would be remiss of me not to look to the future of our club in this report. For the first time in our clubs history, this season saw us end the season with only surveillance patrols due to the world-wide pandemic of COVID-19. What this means for the next few seasons financially for the club is uncertain, but my educated guess would be that funding will be harder to receive, grant funding will be competitive with many clubs losing their major sponsors of bars and supporters club and pokies. Sponsorships and donations will likely be less as the Australian economy tries to recover from the consequences of enforced lockdowns and shutdowns of so many businesses, small and large. So I would say this, every year we acknowledge the good position we are in financially but this will only ever sustain us for one season. The next season already has some large expenses with our roof and Tractor being replaced. So next season, we will need to be tighter with our spending, dig deeper for extra funding and fight for every cent that we need to run our amazing club.

Due to my own work and family commitments, this next AGM I will hand the role of Treasurer to Nadene Kugler and return to assistant. I am positive that Nadene and the committee will keep our clubs



financials in control.

A couple of personal thank you's....to Sean Fallon for your stable leadership and direction, it is always a pleasure working with you, to Karen for your passion for this club and steering us to what is right, to Emu your enthusiasm is catching, to the rest of the Management committee your time and love for this club means it will continue to provide members and the Stradbroke community with so much more than lifesaving. And finally, to my family, Andy, Tas and Hugo I know I have been up early at the computer every day and then running around each morning to make it to school and work. Thank you for letting me put the surf club before you this year.

Thank you so much for coming over, helping out and ensuring we had another successful season!

In support of the program I am incredibly proud to have run 167 events & activities this season, reaching

over 527,407 people with our surf safety messages over 324 campaign days. I wanted to become a Surf Girl to give back to my Club, as I have seen so many inspiring women do before me. For me, the Surf Girl program provides a platform to reach an incredible amount of people through community awareness - to both share my experiences and save more lives.

Highlights for the season for me began right with my first event as we united the locals of the island for our "Christmas in July". This fun dinner was a great way to bring the island residents together and show them how important our Surf Club is to island life. Many commented that they had never been inside the Surf Club, and had no idea of the logistics behind our patrolling operations despite the significant period of time they had lived on the island. They were, however, well aware of the work our Club had done saving lives on the beaches and many stories were shared over a cheeky mulled wine.

An incredible support this season for our fundraising efforts came from many local businesses who donated their products or services, including Rae Green from Ray White North Stradbroke Island who sponsored the entire cost of our 2020 Straddie Calendar. Thanks to all the local photographers and club members who sent in their snaps, this season's calendars were a sell-out! There is even an island rumour that former QLD premier Anna Bligh purchased one for her home as she loves to holiday on Straddie and support the local lifesavers. Other fantastic fundraisers for our club included the Mega Summer Raffle, 70's & 80's night, Grill'd Local matters month winners, Egg-stra Epic Easter Raffle and of course Prawns at the Point. In total I am incredibly proud to share that over \$60 000 was raised through



the Surf Girl campaign.

For me, my most memorable event was the Guinness World record attempt for the "Largest Beach Safety Lesson" which included nippers, parents, members and public. With a final total of 318 people I am incredibly proud of the amount of community awareness and exposure for our organisation this



World record attempt provided in broadcasting our surf safety messages. On 26th June 2020, our record was offically recognised by Guinness World Records and I couldn't be happier.

The 'Anyone Can Be A Lifesaver' campaign went viral online, reaching over 12,000 views alone on Facebook, sharing the message that while some of us are tall, fit, men, all muscles, there is so much more to being a lifesaver. Huge thank you to the members involved for sharing their story and encouraging new members to get involved. These major community awareness drives functioned as high impact campaigns to gain support for our surf safety messages and beach safety campaigns over the summer.

Growing up through the organisation, becoming a Surf Girl has been a personal goal of mine for over 10 years. These were women I looked up to for the incredible amount of passion and drive they had, to develop our organisation. Being a Surf Girl came with no surprises and I am so proud of all I have achieved in such a short time. This program has not only grown my passion for our message but also facilitated personal and professional growth too.

Being a Surf Girl is a mammoth effort, but I could not have made it this far without the incredible support of our club. Thank you to everyone who attended events, bought raffle tickets or showed me how you yell for "help" during my many surf safety talks. Thank you to my incredible committee for encouraging me to reach for my biggest goals. Thank you to all the Surf Girls past who have inspired and mentored me on my journey. A huge thank you to my family who have endured many impromptu meetings and brainstorming sessions. My biggest thanks of all goes to my incredibly supportive, passionate and dedicated partner, Will, who has challenged me to reach higher and achieve more than I ever thought possible. What a journey this year has been for us both! Thank you for helping me grow!

And finally, thank you to SLSQ for facilitating the Surf Girl Program and helping to create and inspire the future leaders of our organisation.



Looking forward, as a proud member of Point Lookout SLSC, it has been an honour to help shape the future of our Club by developing our Strategic Plan this season. From this process I have developed a personal goal of becoming Point Lookout's second female president. In the mean time I am looking forward to engaging in the youth and member development space, as I follow through the incredible youth of our club on the Cairns Trip member engagement program, we ran this season.

At the time of printing, there is no new plan to replace the Surf Girl ball, postponed due to COVID-19 restrictions. SLSQ is working on a replacement awards presentation to announce winners and award recipients. I would like to sincerely thank every person who has supported me to achieve all of my Surf Girl program goals. Whilst the program was at times challenging, I feel I have grown immensely, becoming stronger, more resilient, a better leader, and a better surf lifesaver as a result.

It was great to see some members out collecting in new and different ways i.e. markets, sporting events, seeking business donations and having a wonder through their local pub.


Thank-you to every member who walked the pavement or assisted on this day, especially our JA families who collected the majority of the funds.

Wayne Maxwell Cole joined the Surf Life Saving movement at Point Lookout - North Stradbroke Island in September 1968. He gained his Bronze Medallion on November, 18 1968. From there he has amassed 147 awards including various Silver Medallions and his Gold Medallion. He still holds over 30 awards and has recorded 640 patrol hours as at the 2018/19 Annual Report but we have has no doubt that there would potentially be hundreds of unrecorded water safety hours for junior activities and IRB (Inflatable rescue boat) driver and crew hours from those earlier years. As you all know Wayne is still very actively involved in the Club in Junior Activities, Club Training and Proficiency to name just a few areas of his involvement. Congratulations Wayne, we are all so proud of your achievements!

## SLSA MERITORIOUS AWARD

On New Year's Day 2019, Frenchman's Beach at North Stradbroke Island was experiencing rough conditions and its usual multiple rips when tragedy occurred.

At 12.10pm, Lifeguard Logan Specht, on his lunchbreak at the top of Frenchman's Headland was alerted by a member of the public about a struggling swimmer 150m offshore. Logan looked over the cliff edge, saw the swimmer and immediately contacted the Point Lookout station letting them know he was going down to help.

Logan instructed his friend Tim MacDonald to take the soft pack down the steps, took the rescue board from his vehicle and ran down the side of the cliff. At 12.15pm, Logan and the Main Beach IRB driver and crew arrived at the patient who was face down, unconscious and unresponsive, pulled the patient into the IRB and headed back to Frenchman's Beach.

The patient was a 46-year old male whose daughter was also at the beach. At 12.18pm, CPR began with Lifeguard, Surf Life Saving crew Alex Langenberg and Anna Prasek, and members of the public helping. At 12.20pm Gil Rhodes arrived as WR8 Operator and began scene management coordinating resources and SurfCom.

For over an hour, a diverse team consisting of the lifeguard, surf lifesavers – an off duty nurse, supportive members of the public, Queensland Ambulance Service officers, and R500 Flight doctors, did their very best to give the patient every chance of surviving, continuing CPR, staying at the scene, moving him away from the incoming tide, supporting each other and of course, comforting the patient's daughter.

Sadly at 1.30pm, doctors pronounced the patient deceased. This was the first major incident for many involved, so peer support was significant and the debrief acknowledged the remarkable effort by all team members.

### LIFE MEMBER - DAVID WESTBY

Life membership is the Club's highest honour awarded to those who have distinguished themselves by providing extraordinary and conspicuous service to our Club. Dave Westby is one of those rare individuals who typifies the motto of the surf lifesaving movement "Vigilance and Service".

Dave's association with Point Lookout SLSC began in 1996 when he, his then wife Michelle and 3 children joined the Club as a family activity. Like many in our organisation, Dave did not set out with the intention of chasing achievements. However, through his passion, enthusiasm, commitment and tireless work for over two decades he has made an invaluable contribution to our Club and its members.

Becoming a patrolling member in 1996, Dave has progressed from being a "nipper parent" to a point where he is, indeed, a valuable part of our Club on many levels – covering patrols, administration, lifesaving support, examinations and training, nipper education, coordination of fundraising events... the list is endless.

Dave has taken on many roles within our Club over the years, and has always displayed drive and enthusiasm (mixed with larrikin) in his achievements to date.

Dave is one of a few members who have held the roles of Club Captain and Club President, which truly reflects his leadership qualities and the significant impact he has had on our Club. And on top of those achievements, he has continued to be an age leader for our nipper members for in excess of 20 years, long after his own children have progressed through the nipper ranks.

Since attaining his Bronze Medallion on 30 November 1996, Dave has completed 1,750 patrol hours (at the completion of the 2018/19 season). Dave is still an active patrolling member for our Club, sharing his knowledge and expertise in this area with younger members.

He has undertaken the role of Patrol Captain for at least ten consecutive years, from 2007 to 2016. There, he has led teams of countless numbers of lifesavers each season, and has ensured our motto of Vigilance and Service remains strong to this day.

Dave obtained his Silver Medallion Patrol Captain award in the 2004/2005 season and in 2012 obtained his 10 year National Patrol Service Award.

Dave has contributed numerous hours to Operations Support Services with his RWC patrols at Point Lookout, and continues these patrols on a regular basis.

As a vital member of the Club's Management Committee, Dave has held the management position of Director of Lifesaving in 2011/12, 2016/17- 19/20.

Dave has completed numerous rescues whilst patrolling in the red and yellow, with the most notable and more recent being worthy of a bravery award nomination, namely the rescue earlier this year (March 2018) where Dave was instrumental in the rescue of two teenagers, who were swimming on Frenchmans Beach on a day when 2-3mtr swells were running and it was treacherous. The teenagers were very lucky to have survived their ordeal.

Dave held the position of Club House Director in 2007/08 (a shared position that season), which gave him a detailed insight into the maintenance required on the clubhouse and facilities.

His forte in facilities comes from his trade as a qualified plasterer and his ability to render walls and repair ceilings where necessary. The time and effort that Dave has committed to the clubhouse facilities, using the experience and knowledge of his trade background, has saved countless dollars, and ensured that our clubhouse facilities are well maintained and safe to use.

He has served on the Building Committee for many years, a committee with large responsibility but never a large enough budget. Dave was instrumental in renovation/repair work which saw the floor of the girls' bunkroom/roof of the IRB shed being fireproofed, a massive but extremely essential project.

Dave's penchant for volunteering and taking on positions within our Club started in 1999/2000 season, after just four years in nippers, when he was elected as Vice Chairperson for Junior Activities, a position he held for five years.

Usually a member with superb leadership skills would progress from Club Captain to Club President in their lifesaving career. But true to typical to "Westby" style, Dave has done things his way whilst still benefitting Point Lookout SLSC.

Dave held the position of Club President for 3 consecutive years in 2004/05, 2005/06, 2006/07.

Finishing his stint as Club President, Dave then took on the role of Club Captain for three consecutive years in 2008/09, 2009/10, 2010/11 and has served on multiple Committees over numerous years.

Dave has always availed himself for fundraising activities, including the old pub raffles (both mainland and island), and the annual House to House Collection where he notably always collects the big dollars. It is fair to say that Dave has always participated and lead from the front in actively fundraising during his time with our Club.

For several years, Dave attended the Aussie Titles workforce activities at Kurrawa midweek, and then coordinated patrols on the island on the weekends.

For many seasons Dave donned the Red, White and Blue noddy to represent Point Lookout SLSC as part of the Masters Surf Boat crew.

He has competed in IRB Racing, crewing for a Master's team in the IRB surf and mass races, and was never afraid of the tough conditions often faced at the pointy end of a boat.



Dave has been a Training Officer for the Bronze Medallion and Advanced Resuscitation awards since 2003, and has taken numerous squads through these awards, ensuring that our members are sufficiently trained in lifesaving skills for patrols. He is also an Assessor for the Bronze Medallion award, ensuring that candidates have been trained to a sufficient standard for our Club.

In 2005, he qualified as a Training Officer for IRB's and went on to become an Assessor in 2017.

There would be many members, past and present, ranging from nippers to nipper parents, who have benefitted from Dave's expertise and knowledge. He has been a nipper age group leader for nearly 20 years, and the kids admire and respect him for the time he invests.

For many years, Dave has helped to conduct Bronze Medallion Camp at the start of the season, which is a week long commitment and an annual fixture on our Club's calendar. Dave has also provided leadership and coordination for the annual Canadian Lifeguard Camp, which is a five day intensive camp for international lifesavers from Canada to obtain their Australian equivalent qualification.

Dave introduced an Education Camp for first year cadets (those members graduating out of Under 14's from nippers) at the start of each season, where they learnt valuable skills to take them into a fresh season, such as local island knowledge and culture, club history and building friendships.

He also initiated a Sydney Youth Trip, with 11 of our younger members visiting other Clubs and representing our club interstate.

Selection for Life Membership includes extraordinary service and personal sacrifice above and beyond the normal duties of a member, as well as displaying loyalty, leadership and commitment to the members and the Club.

Dave Westby has excelled in positions of responsibility for our Club, he is a larrikin with a heart of gold, but is fiercely loyal to the red, white and blue of Point Lookout.

During his 21 year history with the Point Lookout SLC, Dave has held many Executive/Management positions, senior leadership and committee roles and has attained 96 SLSA awards for service, education and competency, some of which are listed below.

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

# NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (Qld). The Committee has determined that the Association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

Initial application of AASB 15 and AASB 1058

The Association has adopted AASB 15 Revenue from Contracts with Customers and AASB 1058 Income of Not-

for-Profit Entities for the first time in the current year with a date of initial application of 1 May 2019.

The Association has applied AASB 15 and AASB 1058 using the cumulative effect method which means the comparative information has not been restated and continues to be reported under AASB 111, AASB 118, AASB 1004 and related interpretations.

There is no significant impact when applying AASB 15 and AASB 1058 given the simplicity of the Association's

(a) Plant and Equipment

Plant and equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the remaining life of the lease

(b) Income Tax

The Association is a not for profit which is exempt from Income Tax

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Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

(d) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the entity reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is exemsed to the income statement.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

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Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

## (f) Revenue and Other Income

tincome

When the Association receives grant income, it assesses whether the contract is enforceable and has sufficiently specific performance obligations in accordance with AASB 15. When both conditions are satisfied, the Association:

Identifies each performance obligation relating to the grant;

Recognises a contract liability for its obligations under the agreement; and

 Recognises revenue as it satisfies its performance obligations. If the contract is not enforceable or does not have sufficiently specific performance obligations, the Association recognises income immediately in the month and loses

Annual membership subscriptions are recorded as revenue in the financial year that they relate to.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

## (h) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST receivable from, or payable to the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

## (j) Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are elassified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

## Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.
