PRESIDENT

In this, the 73rd season of the Point Lookout Surf Life Saving Club, the Club has grown in so many ways; some for the positive and some negative.

The Club is made up of many assets both tangible and intangible, the biggest and most important Club asset is of course you; *our members*. After that we have our buildings, our vehicles, our rescue equipment such as IRB's, boards, trailers etc.

On the intangible side, we have the biggest and most important asset and that is our Club spirit; our willingness to volunteer, our willingness put Club before

man, our willingness to train and learn and then to spend countless hours on the beach always watching and very occasionally acting on our training. Another intangible which is critical to the Club is that of our friendships, our mateship, our banding together so that we are not one single person, we are a collective of many who act together to make everything, and possibly anything, happen.

Our Club Priorities are Patrols, our Facilities, Fundraising, Administration and Competition.

Patrols: Alex Langenberg, Gavin Kugler, our Vice Captains Jesse Mantell and Lana Burke and our dedicated band of Patrol Captains have risen to the challenge. Our patrols have generally been of a good strength, our standards kept strong with our members standing at the water's edge, our patrol inspections have gone well but, above all else, our beaches have been kept safe.

Facilities for the Members: We have been well served by Andy Pryor who, in his role as Clubhouse Director, has also fed from 2 members to 40 every weekend and also keep the Club buildings in good order. Will Hagan, as you all know, has slaved over the Point Lookout SLSC Strategic Plan and which, at the time of writing this report, was due for imminent release. We have good levels of rescue gear, the vehicles are all in good running order and we have finished the season with very few scratches and dents in the Clubhouse and on the vehicles.

Fundraising: This Club priority has been much more challenging than in recent seasons, Covid has certainly wreaked havoc with our efforts but we have seen a triple whammy, Covid curtailing events together with less money coming in from long standing sponsors and donors such as Sibelco and then much increased expenses such as building maintenance and insurances. Nadene Kugler as our Treasurer, Will



Hagan as Finance Director and Ann-Sophie Sullivan as Membership Director have done their very best to keep the money coming in and watching and controlling the money going out. We had to approach our traditional house to house collection day with no knocking on doors, though Will came up with a contingency plan, we ran a fridge raffle and much delayed Prawns at the Point. Thanks to all involved for helping and selling and serving to keep these funds rolling in. Between Nat May and Nadene Kugler we have been chasing grants all season with reasonable success.

Junior Activities and the IRB team have also been very active and good at keeping all income and expenses in balance so that it is not a drain on the Club's bank balance.

Administration: This takes many forms, by far and away Nat May is the glue that keeps it all together for the Club, she punches through so much work for us and always with a smile and a great attitude. Nat and Karen Bodger, as Club Secretary, have kept the whole show moving forward. Administration is also about ensuring the patrols logs are all up to date, insurances paid, food ordered and paid for, competition and training paperwork completed, grant monies applied for, actioned and accounted for. The business of running the Club is now a joint effort between volunteers and our paid administrator. Paperwork is the bane of everyone's existence, it has now becoming a major workload for the Club especially in areas such as training, proficiencies, risk management and approvals for camps and carnivals.

Competition: Scott Stephenson is back on the Management team this season and has been steering Surf Sports for the Club. Whilst we are never going to be a powerhouse, we compete solidly. It is amazing to hear the results from both the individuals and teams on behalf of the Club. Thank you for your dedication in your continued training effort, paying for your expenses and getting out there competing and having fun.

Patrols: The table on the following page shows patrolling statistics for the last 6 seasons. As you can see the amount of hours per person has been increasing over time.

Given the impact of Covid and reduced overall membership numbers, this season has shown a strong increase in patrolling members at 220 members who patrolled for the season for an average of 55 hours per patrolling member. I believe that this is a strong endorsement for the current roster system (2 shifts




per day) and also for the selflessness or altruism of our members.

Membership: The table below shows what our Club was looking like at the mid-season point, the full year result would show the membership in a better light. To me this indicates a drop off due to Covid and the constraints on numbers for Junior Activities, once again, primarily due to Covid. You can see from the above graph that we continue to hold our strong membership base when you look back 5-6 years ago.

Assets: The buildings are in need of continued



expenditure for their maintenance. This season commenced with our new roof in place, pleasingly we are now leak free, hence the damage to ceilings and paintwork could then also be rectified. In the off-season the girls bunk room was also given a major overhaul with a new locker and wet room, new access to the bathrooms, a relay of bunks, curtains and flooring, ceiling repairs and painted, from what I have heard the consensus is that it's much appreciated. We also managed to get the columns to South Gorge replaced and considerably updated – this was a major piece of work. Works have also gone on at the Cylinder shed. If you refer back to last year's report this delivers on all proposed works for the season.

Club Finances: The above all comes at a major cost to our bank balance, and, of course we planned for

the works. We sought and gained several grants and had donations from Bluescope Steel (thanks again to Peter Burke) BUT this is unsustainable. Our Club finances are suffering and the continued cost of keeping the clubhouse in a habitable, functionable and safe state is chewing up our reserves. At the current rate of spend we have 2-3 years of reserves left if we do not find a solution. I am sure Nadene will expand upon the Club finances.

I strongly feel that we need to pause and reflect on what we have and where we are going.

Strategic Plan: Will Hagan has steered the Club through an incredible piece or work, namely the Strategic Plan, this is a critical document for the Club. At the time writing this report we will be launching the Plan to the members over the coming weeks. Like all good plans it is a living document so it will adjust and change over time. We have held numerous open sessions in the lead up to the launch for everyone to have their say. What the plan does is map out a possible future sustainability for the Club. It focuses in on our lifesaving services, our membership, external engagement, our facilities and infrastructure and our finance and administration. In essence all of the elements we need for a healthy functional and functioning Club.

This also heralds changes so please engage with us, don't sit back and comment to the walls, tell us what you are thinking. I would like to call out Darren Woodward, Wayne Cole, George Hill, Pete Josefski and Matthew 'Emu' Robinson for their continued input, attendance and support for Will during this two-year process.

As we head to the AGM, there are some gaps in our membership nominations but I am confident that as always, the Club will thrive and survive no matter what the challenge. Please consider what you can do for your Club, as its always been Club before person and now more than ever we can use that support.

The Club continues to uphold its tradition of keeping the beaches of North Stradbroke Island safe for everyone, the growing influx of day trippers who are unsure of the sea and, in particular Straddie, continues to keep us busy.

The community in which we operate has been faced with extremely challenging times due to the ongoing existence of COVID-19. The Club has not been immune to these

challenges, and we have seen significant impacts on our income streams this season due to this operating environment.

The end of season sees the Club post an operating loss of \$170,745, overall cash position of \$336,984 and total member funds \$960,414.

Our income for 2020/21 has been considerably impacted by limited opportunities to fundraise as the Club traditionally has. Overall, total income for the season was \$369,095 – a decrease of over \$175,000.

Fundraising income was \$46,290 – a decrease of over \$100,000. Recognition and thanks must be extended to Will Hagan, Director of Finance, for thinking outside of the box for House to House (SOS Appeal) and implementing a QR code for a letterbox drop rather than the traditional door knock. Although funds raised were half of what the Club would usually raise (total funds raised \$14,112), the Club was looking at no funds at one stage due to COVID restrictions. Thank you, Will, for your efforts in this regard as well as driving the Summer Celebrations Raffle and raising much needed funds for the Club in a challenging year.

The Club's main fundraising activity Prawns at the Point was postponed from its traditional January timeslot to 1 May 2021 due to a COVID lockdown in January. The income and expenses for this event will be spread over two financial years due to its timing. Despite these challenges, the event raised over \$20,000 for the Club.

The Club once again sold calendars as a fundraising activity. Thank you to Ray White North Stradbroke Island for your continued sponsorship of the calendars.

Pleasingly we were able to secure numerous grants this season. Thank you to our Club Administrator Natalie May and the team at SLSQ Grant Seeking Unit for your hard work in securing these vital grants for the Club.

Grants were also received from the Department of Social Services, Gambling Community Benefit Fund and Redland City Council totalling \$18,622 which will be carried over to next season.

Despite the decrease in income, the Club still costs over \$500,000 per season to operate. This season saw expenses totalling \$539,840 including \$130,239 on Clubhouse Maintenance and Repairs. Clubhouse maintenance included the installation of a new roof, update to the girl's bunkroom, window repairs and concrete pylons repairs.

CLUBHOUSE DIRECTOR

What a challenging season. From Covid restrictions and lockdowns, to lightning strikes and torrential rain closing both Main and Cylinder Beaches, the elements have tested Point Lookout.

While the Clubhouse sits proudly on the hill, maintenance is a constant work in progress. This season, with the aid of a generous community grant, the Club replaced 6 structural



columns on the South Gorge side of the Clubhouse that were in need of major repair. A big thank you to Kybro Constructions for completing these works. This was a complicated process involving supporting the upper storey of the clubhouse while undertaking the repairs to the structural columns and we appreciate the professional expertise of Pat Trevor-Jones and his contractors.

Much needed maintenance and repairs were completed this season to the Cylinder shed with the roller door, personnel door and whirly birds to the roof being replaced. The Club was able to complete the Cylinder Shed repairs with grant funds from the Port of Brisbane Authority.

A big thank you to the Patrol Captains for stepping up on the weekends to provide lunches and meals to patrolling members. It has been much appreciated. Due to budget constraints, as we move into next season, the Club can provide fresh fruit for patrolling members but regrettably cannot continue to provide lunches. I want to take this opportunity to thank Emu and John Gardiner for all of their help and guidance throughout the Season. It turns out, you can teach an old dog new tricks!!

The Club was also able to streamline the payment process for meals for patrolling members by introducing the 'Square'. While, at times, there were some technical issues, overall this system of payment was more efficient than the cash payment system and the Club will be continuing this payment process for next season.

A significant source of revenue for the Club continues to be group bookings for school camps. Renovations to the girl's bunkroom last season continue to benefit the Club for these school camps, providing improved facilities for groups to utilise the Club's amenities. It would be appreciated if all patrolling members could keep this in mind when packing up and leaving on Sunday afternoons to ensure the Club is presented at



its best for any groups that may be booked. Sweeping floors, wiping benches and general tidiness around club all contribute to that first impression when groups arrive and first impressions count!

The next major works on the maintenance list will be repainting the Clubhouse – both interior and exterior. Dulux continue to support surf lifesaving clubs around the country and have supplied 300 litres of paint. Works are expected to be completed within the next 12 months.

The building committee are also reviewing the efficiency of the solar panels to reduce operating costs for the Club. While there have been some issues throughout the season with gas bottles and hot water supply, the problem has been identified and the Committee are formulating a plan to rectify this issue. Thank you for your help and input to my fellow building committee members - Brent May, Jon Bryant , Sean Fallon, Dave Westby and also to Merv and McInnes for their continued work around the Club.

Looking forward to a new season..... without the challenges of a pandemic. Stay safe and swim between the flags.

FINANCE



I first wish to thank our many sponsors for their generous donations, both monetary and services in-kind, as their ongoing support enables us to successfully deliver our lifesaving services. Thank you to Nadene Kugler who has been a powerhouse as our incoming treasurer this season. While members may not be aware of how much work she's put in to ensure we have the

financial means to continue operations, they should be extremely grateful. Nadene's role was made significantly harder by the impacts of COVID on our grant and event income, coupled with the increasing costs of clubhouse maintenance, yet she's still done a fabulous job ensuring the Club saves money at every turn. Thank you also to Nat May for her work with grant applications, bringing in much-needed funds at a time when grants are harder to come by and more competitively sort after.

As expected, this season was financially challenging due to COVID. Many events were either cancelled or scaled back. For the first time in over two decades we were not knocking on doors asking for donations, instead dropping flyers in letterboxes, the consequence of which was 1/3 of our usual income. Thank you to the small percentage of members who assisted. As I mentioned in my report last year, we desperately need all members - no matter what membership category - to assist with fundraising efforts until we develop larger streams of commercial income. In the future I would also like to see far more members interacting with our external facing social media accounts as likes and comments go an enormous way to increasing post exposure under the current algorithms. This is especially important when the Club runs fundraisers to drive engagement. Sharing these posts to your story or page takes mere seconds.

Capitalising on An-Sophie's successful fundraisers last season as Surf Girl, we again sold calendars and ran another fridge raffle with the support of Redland Sporting Club, with both ventures raising several thousand dollars, strongly boosted by the nipper families who helped sell calendars and raffle tickets. Despite a last minute COVID scare in Brisbane forcing it to be postponed, Prawns at the Point eventually went ahead at the beginning of May. Thanks to some fantastic auction items and a great crowd, we were able to raise as much as previous years despite the smaller attendance. There were many great learnings from all events about future ways to generate greater income for less effort by our members.

Even as a registered charity organisation, we need to

work to make as much money as possible, because that money will ultimately provide us with more equipment and more members with greater skillsets, thereby protecting more lives. Island tourism numbers are continually increasing and we need to remain proactive. To help drive this need for growth I first began the strategic planning process in 2016 with Management, but identified many limitations in that early document. So, in April 2018 after identifying several potential threats to our future sustainability, I began again with what has become a three-year undertaking and countless workshop hours. This time every member has been able to contribute their thoughts and ideas to shape our future, from redefining our priorities to shaping our long-term vision, and to those who took this opportunity, thank you. I'd like to especially call out Darren Woodward for facilitating our discussions over this period, and Sean Fallon, Matthew Robinson, and Ann-Sophie Sullivan for becoming the backbone I could rely upon over this past year and a half to be present at workshops to help synthesise ideas.

I'm incredibly proud this season to have delivered the 2021-2025 Strategic Plan for the Club, the first of its kind that will guide our future decision making. While it has been a mammoth task, I'm especially proud that every Club member was able to provide input to create a document we, as a Club, can get behind. Work was also done to design a new office bearer structure to better support the Strategic Plan implementation, and I look forward to seeing that come into effect over the next season in conjunction with much-needed By-Law updates. While the current structure has served us well these past two decades, the new structure will allow for a group to specifically focus on the Club's future, while a second group focuses on the day-to-day running of the Club. The biggest driver of this proposed restructure was to evenly spread the workload among office bearer whilst creating accountability. Although the majority of members may not be interested or wish to concern themselves with future strategy preferring to leave it to Management to 'deal with,' the Strategic Plan will ultimately shape day-to-day operations so I encourage all members to remain well-aware of what's happening. Unfortunately, some members took issue with the Strategic Plan and proposed office bearer restructure, and to those members I wish to remind them that implementing the solid plan we have and iterating as we go will be significantly more effective than trying to produce a perfect plan before we begin. The Club is currently in a difficult financial situation, and I believe this Strategic Plan is the foundation upon which the new Management can drive future growth. There are many great opportunities we can capitalise on, and many threats we can pre-emptively avoid. It is now up to the incoming Management to develop a Business Plan (set goals) on the back of this Strategic Plan to make that possible. Several fantastic ideas were proposed over the past 3 years and I'm excited to see them actioned



through this process.

If the proposed structural changes are supported, this, and several other Director positions I've previously held over the past 8 seasons will become obsolete. I'd like to thank all those I've had the pleasure of sitting on Management with during this time to better our Club. All said and done, the fundamentals will never change so I'll see you all on the beach next season in the red and yellow.

- Inaugural Chairman of the ILS Asia Pacific Region Sport Committee


John's life has been engrained into Surf Life Saving and his lifelong commitment will ensure that the future of Surf Lifesaving is both positive and progressive.

The kitchen was also upgraded to commercial standards.

A luncheon, attended by 120 guests, on 21 March 2021 at the Redlands RSL celebrated the achievements and contributions of:

* Foundation Member Len McAfee

* Life Members John McInnes, Jim Comerford and Terry Daley

* Club stalwarts Greg Litherland and Ernie Stevenson

Len McAfee is a Foundation Member of the Surf Club and a founding bronze medallion holder, awarded 24 January 1948 (Bronze number 25566). Len held the position of Chief Instructor 1949/50, Club Secretary 1951/52 and was the first Open Club Champion 1949/50.

Terence 'Terry' Daley was awarded his bronze

medallion 28 February 1959 (Bronze number Q1843). Terry was Club Captain 1963/64, awarded Life Membership in 1973 and SLSA 60 year Long Service Award in 2018/19. Terry has been President of the Old Boys and is the unofficial Club historian.

James 'Jim' Comerford was the 70th Club member to achieve his bronze medallion on 13 January

1962 (Bronze number Q3156). Jim was one of the early pioneers for competition for Point Lookout and had a passion for competing in first aid. A quiet achiever for the Club but always there to contribute and lend a hand. Jim was Chief Instructor in 1967/68, awarded Life Membership in 2014 and SLSA 50 year Long Service Award in 2018/19.

Ernest 'Ernie' Stevenson achieved his bronze medallion on 30 January 1965 (Q539). Ernie contributed

immensely to the various building/ renovations of the Clubhouse sourcing donated materials and labour. He has been a supporter of the Club and the Old Boys for 45 years.

Greg Litherland (pictured centre) achieved his bronze medallion on 12 June 1966 (Bronze number



Q5269). Greg was awarded the Club Esteem Award on two occasions – 1965/ 66 and 1992/93. He enjoyed competition and competed in masters events including the world championships. Greg is an iconic character of the Club and the Island recognised by his hard hat. Greg contributed immensely to building the Clubhouse and its maintenance. Greg is also

widely recognised for his wooden ski building expertise, used by Club members and early pioneers of Surf Life Saving competition.

John McInnes achieved his bronze medallion 1 January 1968 (Bronze number Q5824). John was Club Treasurer 1969/70 to 1975/76 and through his creativity in fundraising, contributed to the Club being in a strong financial position. He was

awarded Life Membership in 1978 and recognised with a SLSA 50 year Long Service Award in 2018/19.
