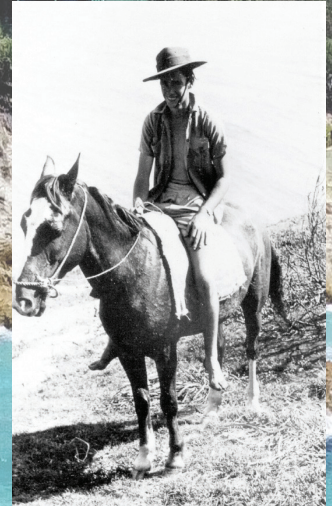
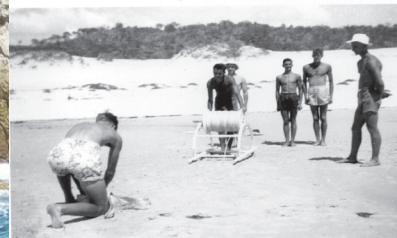


74th ANNUAL REPORT

2021/22 Season



VALE Foundation Members Tony Durbidge & Alan Gunn



In a two-month period last year, our Club lost two of its Foundation members and "Bronzies" from the Club's inaugural squad on 24th of January 1948.

On 12th March 2021, Alan Gunn passed away aged nearly 94 and on 19th May, 2021 the club's first Captain, Tony Durbidge, passed away at Point Lookout aged 92.

The following is a brief outline of their involvement with our Club – there are several stories involving our Foundation members in the Club's history book – "60 Years Between the Flags" which can be found on our website under "Our Club > Club History".

Alan Gunn was born in July 1927 and his first years were spent at "One Mile" just outside of Dunwich where his father was convalescing after World War II. At the time of the formation of the Club, he was an apprentice boiler maker working in Brisbane and his family had a holiday shack at Amity Point. As a regular visitor to the Point in 1947, he was part of the group of young men who along with a few of the residents, were involved in the rescue of several young people in the Swimming Gorge which highlighted the need for a Surf Lifesaving Club.

With the wheels set in motion with QLD State Centre, a Bronze Squad started training with a loaned box reel and on 18th October 1947, the fledgling trainees along with former Mooloolaba Lifesaver Bob Durbidge (Tony's father) carried out what would be a body recovery of a man in the Swimming Gorge at Pandanus. Hoping they could get the patient to shore and carry out resuscitation they put every effort in to his retrieval, but it was too late. Alan, along with two other bronze crew, were washed into the water and cut up badly on the rocks and could easily have drowned. For his efforts, Bob Durbidge was awarded the club's first Meritorious Bravery Award.

Alan had the honour of carrying out the club's first mobile patrols on "Soxy" the resident Brumby. Alan will go down in history as being a Foundation member and First Bronze squad member of our Club.

Tony Durbidge was born in March 1929 in Brisbane but by the age of ten he was First Mate on his stepfather's fishing boat working along the Queensland coast. In September 1941 while fishing in North Queensland, Bob Durbidge's boat was "commissioned" by the ADF for the war effort. Using one of the tender boats, he returned to Brisbane with his family, when they did a day trip to Point Lookout with a view to setting up a base for fishing. Bob selected an area in the southern corner of Cylinder Beach, and this is where the family lived for 7 years and Tony started his 79 years of "living under the light" at the Point. When World War II finished in 1945, Point Lookout started to open up to visitors and Bob Durbidge started the Point Lookout Bus Service of which Tony and his younger brother John were drivers. By now they lived in a cottage on "Durbo Hill" and set up a workshops and ice works nearby.

Bob and Tony were part of the rescue in the Swimming Gorge previously mentioned and Bob Durbidge assisted the young men along with help from the Point Lookout Progress Association, to form the Point Lookout S.L.S.C. Bob was the inaugural President and Tony the Club Captain. Several of the young clubbies also helped out driving the buses in busier times.

In the early 1960's, Tony and another Club Member – Vic Brook, built a drive on drive off barge called "Point Lookout" which ran from near the Cleveland jetty to Dunwich. They also built the Point Lookout Hotel and Tony, and his wife Ellie ran this for 5 years. Various other ventures followed and Tony built a block of flats where the bus workshops used to be. Tony and his wife Ellie were Point Lookout icons and along with his stepfather Bob and younger brother John, helped form our Club.

Both Alan and Tony were part of the very first Bronze Squad. Both Gentlemen were very humble and hardworking family men and will forever be remembered for their efforts with establishing our club.

Tony's daughter Jane wrote a biographical account of Tony's life in 2020 "Tony Remembers ... while Jane writes it down". It is a great read.

serving presidents. Sean's professional and calm management style has been invaluable, particularly over the last couple of seasons dealing with the onset of Covid and the various challenges the Club has had to navigate through. On a personal note, Sean has been a massive help too, by being a sounding board and helping me navigate through the various Club operations. Thanks mate and I look forward to seeing you back on the beach soon.

I've always held this belief, "just because it's always been done, doesn't mean we can't make a change for the better". As a volunteer organisation we sometimes feel we are bound by practices and policies that have just "always been done". Administration - This season saw the invaluable experience of Life Member Natasha Dennis once again taking on the Secretary role for a record 4th time or 11th year combined. Natasha thank you for everything you do, for your calm and measured approach to decision making and the experience you brought this season.

To Nat May, serving once again as our Club Administrator, as Sean mentioned last season, you are the "glue that keeps this whole show together! Thank you for all that you and your wonderful family do for our Club.

More and more as we move into a new decade the administration pile is becoming larger and larger. As a Club we should be all so thankful for the huge load of "behind the scenes" work that is carried out, not only by our paid staff, but our volunteer position holders as well.

Captains - This season saw for the first time in our 74-year history, an all-female Captain team. Led by Club Captain Sarah Sammut supported by Vice Captains Anne-Marie Westby & Hayley Robinson. These ladies did a fantastic job weekend after weekend managing Club and patrol operations, and sometimes our "old maintenance men". You will not find a more passionate and dedicated group of ladies who have the red, white, and blue of our Club through their veins. Thank-you for your support and leadership this season.

Lifesaving - we had less members patrolling than we have had in the last 6 seasons but mother nature was kind to us by closing main beach most weekends from Christmas through the end of season. Thank-you to our Director of Lifesaving Gavin (Kugs) Kugler. I don't think there was a weekend where you were not on patrol in some capacity. Your passion for our Club and setting the highest standard for patrols is inspiring. Coupled with your work as President of the Old Boys, I'm not sure how much time you spend at home.

Finance - Our Club income and finances continue to be a major focus. This season has seen a big turnaround in our end of year bottom line. A huge reason for this is the incredible work done by our Treasurer Nadine Kugler and supported by new Director of Finance Michael Pankhurst. Nadine's work on all things fiscal has been enormous. Her many, many hours spent each week managing the Club's finances has delivered a significant change in our financial outlook. However, encouraging

as it may be, we as a Club need to continue to work towards developing a consistent, sustainable income stream which is above the regular sources of income including grants, donations, and sponsorship. Our Supporter's Club has shown that there is an opportunity and great potential in such income streams.

This also aligns with our current Strategic Plan "build enhanced revenue model"

However, to fully achieve this we must have a facility that can accommodate both worlds. That being high standard patrol operations, and a viable Supporters Club hospitality business.

Membership - Over the last 2 years because of Covid, membership is very fast becoming one of our highest priorities into the next season.

Our membership base and our active patrol base has dropped over the past 2 seasons due to the pandemic and with our Director of Membership position being unfulfilled for the last half of the season has made that space challenging. I really encourage all our members to get behind your Club and tell a friend about Point Lookout SLSC! Tell them about the social, physical and mental benefits of being involved in the surf lifesaving organisation

Moving forward I am confident that with a new motivated Membership Team our membership will begin to increase, not only with our patrolling members but with our membership base in general.

TREASURER



It is with great privilege that I present the Treasurer's Report for the Club's 74th Season.

After the challenges of the past two seasons, it is pleasing for the Club to post an operating surplus of \$77,413, with an overall cash position increase from \$336,984 to \$405,766 and total member funds of \$1,037,827.

Unexpended grants were \$19,460.

Finance and Administration

There are increasing pressures on the Club's volunteer Office Bearers with increased compliance in the areas of finance, training and lifesaving operations. The Office Bearers are well supported by our Club Administrator Natalie May. We are very fortunate as a Club to have such a professional and dedicated Club Administrator. Thank you to Nat for your continued commitment and the enthusiasm you bring to the role – nothing is too much effort. Your work in assisting office bearers undertake their roles is greatly appreciated.

The Club's finances are comprised of the following main income streams – Club Functions and Activities, Donations and Fundraising, Grants, Membership Fees and Merchandise. Income this season was \$553,330.

Member fundraising was \$104,035 including over \$30,000 raised at Prawns at the Point and \$43,902 for the Queensland Lifesavers Appeal. Donations included a \$35,000 donation from the Point Lookout Surf Life Saving Supporters Club. Grants income was \$109,400 including:

Surf Life Saving Australia Beach Safety Equipment Fund	\$15,000

Thank you to the Surf Life Saving Foundation Grant Seeking Unit for their assistance in preparing grant applications on behalf of the Club.

The Club also received \$20,000 from Redland City Council as part of our ongoing partnership agreement with Council to deliver patrol services on North Stradbroke Island. A timing of payments has seen the Club receive this subsidy twice this financial year.

The main expense items for the Club include – Administration and Professional Costs \$60,181, Lifesaving Services \$16,884, Insurance \$39,906, Clubhouse Operations and Maintenance \$34,615, Member Services \$37,452 and Merchandise \$25,508.

A new design for Club swimwear was introduced during the season. Thank you to the Club's Merchandise Officer Fran Wilson for your work in managing this and introducing other new lines of Club merchandise. It is important for members to support the Club in purchasing swimwear. It is a substantial investment by the Club to purchase the swimwear to meet supplier requirements. Stock on hand at year end for swimwear including for Junior Activities was \$24,980.



This season, an audit of the Club's current IT systems was undertaken with a view to improving efficiency and assisting office bearers undertake their duties more effectively. Thank you to Matt Burey for managing this review. A new till system has been purchased for the Supporters Club Bar and SharePoint will be implemented for the coming season to allow increased sharing of information and storage of Club files. Thank you to NR Solutions for your continued support in managing the Club's IT.

Lifesaving Operations

As a Club we exist to provide patrol services to the community and visitors of North Stradbroke Island. Lifesaving operations expenses this year included beach patrol equipment maintenance and supplies \$8,822 and Club vehicles \$8,062. Through the Australian Government's SLSA Beach

Safety Equipment Fund, a new IRB has been ordered at a cost of \$13,800 with expected delivery March 2023.

The Club's lifesaving operations are generously supported by Sealink who transport vehicles and trailers each week during the patrol season and JJ Richards for supplying the diesel fuel for Club vehicles. Thank you both for your continued support of the Club.

Member Services

It is important that the Club continue to invest in developing our members skills through Youth Development Camps, Youth Balls and competition. There is a cost for this development. This should be respected by members – it is a privilege not a right. Member services expenses for the year included Development Camps and Balls \$5,832, Competition Fees \$12,738 and Member Functions and Recognition \$5,662. The Development Camp and Balls expenses included the Great Barrier Reef Trip for the youth members that completed the Youth Engagement Rewards Program in 2019/ 20.



Facilities and Infrastructure

The Clubhouse continues to be a major source of expenditure for the Club.

Rainwater tanks, courtesy of a grant, were installed in July and a new solar inverter in August. A grant has been received to expand the existing solar panels and this will be operational by the end of June 2022. The upgrade and extension of solar panels combined with the new inverter should see a reduction in the Club's electricity expenses albeit the cost of electricity continues to increase.

Redland City Council, as a Club stakeholder, engaged CT Management Group Pty Ltd to conduct a visual inspection of the Club. The report provided recommendations for maintenance with an estimated cost of over \$280,000 over the next three years. The Building Committee are working on a maintenance schedule with the electrical maintenance underway. It is important for the maintenance schedule with projected costs be finalised so the Club can investigate opportunities for funding.

Maintenance and operational costs this financial

year were \$34,615 including:

Michael was always happy to ask questions and for assistance. I look forward to working with you again next season.

Thank you to Pete Josefski, Junior Activities Treasurer, and Dave Finter, Old Boys Treasurer for your diligence in managing the finances for the

respective sub-committees of the Club.

I would like to acknowledge the substantial contribution of Sean Fallon to the Club. Sean has resigned this season as Club President due to relocation to Melbourne for work. Sean has undertaken numerous roles over the years for both the Club and the Supporters Club including Director of Finance, Deputy President and President. Thank you Sean for your commitment and services to the Club.

In conclusion, I encourage members to understand the Club's finances – there is no bottomless pit of funds. Generating sustainable income is a challenge and fundraising is a key activity for the Club. Fundraising assists in funding core activities as well as discretionary expenses such as competition fees and camps.

Despite the turbulence of the season, some things never change. Merv and McInnes still graced us with their company and everyone who swam between the red and yellow flags at Point

Lookout went home safely to their loved ones. Of course, that is why we do what we do.

Firstly, I must begin with a vote of thanks to my Vice Captains - Hayley Robinson and Anne-Marie Westby. This year was the first in the Club's history that we have had an all female leadership team and it was an honour to be a part of. Hayley – you are cool, calm and collected, even in the most stressful times. AM – you are always smiling, and I swear nothing can put you in a bad mood. Both of you set a fantastic example for all members through your dedication and love of our Club and Lifesaving. Together with the unofficial but honourable vice captain Calan Lovitt, we ensured that the Club ran efficiently and patrols were well managed throughout the difficulties of the season.

We started the season with hopes for a covid free world and kicked off with the recently developed Patrol Captains weekend. With the departure of many long standing patrol captains, many PCs were new to the role and we also welcomed a handful of junior members into the fold. It was a valuable weekend that ensured our Patrol Captains were aware of key patrol and Club operating procedures. We are lucky to learn from such experienced members and I thank Cal Lovitt, Mr Cole and Mitch Yates for leading various sessions.

Live-in camp provided all the fun it normally does, as a new squad of Bronzies and SRCs were put through their training. I had the pleasure of attending the week and meeting our youngest members, which is always a highlight of my season. The junior members are the future of our Club and they have always brought a fun energy to the Club. It would be great to see more of them around the clubhouse – I never thought I

would say that!

While we bathed in the bliss of the free world, we had the opportunity to celebrate a very different unprecedented event, that was perhaps my most favourite evening of the season - the celebration of Calan Lovitt completing 3000 hours for our Surf Club. Cal – thank you for 3000 hours and so much more. For your professionalism, passion, high skill level, and also for your friendship to the Club and all members. It has been a privilege and a pleasure to witness your development from a young and uninterested cadet lifesaver to one of the best in Australia. It has been an honour to learn from you and I look forward to many more years with you in the ocean and around our Clubhouse.

Unfortunately, normality didn't stick around for too much longer and we experienced another 6 months of ongoing disruptions. Illness, quarantine requirements, isolation and the threat of vaccine mandates all interrupted the normal operations out of our clubhouse. Notably, case numbers rose over the new year period and from January through March, our patrolling members were affected by illness and associated quarantine and close contact measures. Incredibly, although member numbers were low, the lifesaving family at Point Lookout ensured that all patrols were covered.



It must be acknowledged that we experienced a considerable drop in active members this season from 169 to 139, with many experienced members among those. Consequently, most patrol groups were operating at minimum numbers – an average of 8 members on each of the 8 groups. While this is an unfortunate situation for us as a Club, the flip side of the coin is the very low number of penalty patrols being accrued this season. To that end, a massive thank you must go to all members for their reliability throughout the season, and also to the members who stepped up to sub members in their absence. There were a handful of members who completed in excess of 30 substitute hours, many in addition to their rostered patrol. A very special mention must go to our super subs of the season – Gavin Kugler (106.5 substitute hours), Keith Weinert (71.5) and Andy Pryor (51 substitute hours). Finally, a very special acknowledgement to Don 'Jacko' Jackson in the radio room, with 227.5 volunteer hours.

Generally, volunteer organisations are made up of a lot of people doing a little, and a few people doing a lot. As our membership falls,

we are left with less people doing a little, and it seems there are many who are doing a lot. This year, we have over 20 people to thank for completing in excess of 100 hours. I also extend a massive congratulations to two of our long serving and most dedicated members – Anne-Marie Westby and Andy Pryor – for joining the 1000 hours club and Gary Morthorpe and Scott Stephenson - for joining the 1500 hours club.

In addition to the extensive help of members going above and beyond their normal duties, we were also assisted throughout the season by visiting clubs and members from the Brisbane Lifesaving Service (BLS) – we even managed to poach a few members! Members of BLS were mature, professional and so helpful, and I saw the place anew through their eyes. They loved the family environment and commented many times on the commitment of our members in patrolling a remote location. I was reminded of how special our surf club is and how lucky we are to live and patrol in such a beautiful part of the world.



Somewhere in amongst the covid outbreak South East QLD and Northern NSW experienced one of the countries worst recorded flood disasters. Again, the humanitarian culture of our club was evident, and our members showed the true Australian ideal of 'Looking after your mates', where mates are all Australians. Over the course of three days we supplied and crewed 2 IRBs who were tasked to various jobs around the Brisbane area. Thankyou to the small but dedicated team of members who were always on communications to ensure our teams were always ready.

The last significant event of our season involved the drowning of a man at track 8 on Main Beach over the Easter holidays. A team of Calan Lovitt, Logan Specht, Hayley Robinson, Paul Huddle, Andy Pryor and Elissa Farrow responded to the incident and attempted to resuscitate the man, assisted by Police and Paramedics. The team were professional in their assistance, performing many rounds of CPR, co-ordinating traffic control and consoling family members. Over 75 years of service, the Club continues to learn from every incident we are involved in and this was no different.

This surf club has given me more than I can ever give back, and that is why I patrol. The Point Lookout Surf Club is where I grew up, it is the place of my fondest adolescent memories and where I met some of my greatest friends.

Through the experiences and the training over many years, I know that I will never know the feeling of helplessness that comes from watching someone drown. There is always something I know to do in distressing times – as do all of us. To anyone who supports this place, in any way, you are not only supporting the vision of Surf Life Saving and keeping our beaches safe, you are supporting the development of children, the lifestyle of families, the growth of communities, and supporting the retention of the great Australian spirit of volunteerism, altruism and mateship. Thankyou to all Club members for your generosity and service throughout the season.

On a personal note, there are a few key people I would like to especially thank. Matt Robinson, for always being available to answer a call and all my questions. Nadene Kugler for being my 'club mum' and always knowing when I needed a bit of TLC. Gav Kugler, for always letting me know what needs to be done around the Club and finally, Mr Cole. Thankyou for your ongoing support, advice, wisdom and love for the Club. I have certainly missed having you around this season.

While I may not be back next year, I will certainly find my way back, as I always do, because I can never stay away for too long.

FIRST AID

This season saw the Surf Club go back towards normality after restrictions easing. With borders opening up, tourists were back visiting our beautiful beaches and taking in what Straddie has to offer. With the increase in population to the island it was a surprise to see first aid cases down from last season. We had a total of 194 minor cases (down from 498) and 24 major cases (down from 51).

Three weeks prior to the end of the season we had a call from SurfCom notifying us that there was a swimmer in distress down Main Beach. Five club members of Point Lookout and one Straddie Lifeguard attended the scene. These members not only completed multiple rounds of CPR, they also coordinated with emergency services and assisted with traffic control, whilst the Rescue 500 helicopter landed. Our members went above and beyond; they comforted and consoled family members who were at the scene. Whilst the patient did not survive, the actions of the members involved were invaluable. I received feedback stating that the team's response on scene was fantastic and professional. You should all be so proud of yourselves. It is these stories that make me unbelievably proud to be a part of Point Lookout Surf Life Saving Club.

I would just like to give a massive shout out to Tash Daniels for donating a huge box full of first aid supplies. We greatly appreciate your generosity. Thank you so much! And last but not least, another massive shout out to all of our Point Lookout Club Members, Brisbane Lifesaving members and Straddie Lifeguards who have assisted on and off the beach this 2021/22 season. I look forward to seeing you back at the surf club next season. Enjoy the off season and stay safe!

MOBILE SERVICES



It gives me great pleasure to present the Mobile Services Officer Report for the Point Lookout Surf Club 2021- 2022 season.

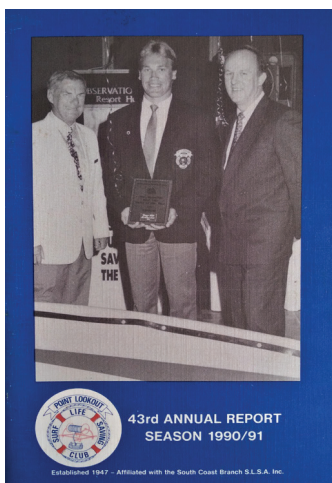

Other members from that season and still with the Club – Dave Finter and Darren Woodward (Active Reserve), Matthew Robinson & Karen Bodger (Award members), Rick Bodger, Shane Modini & Natasha Dennis (Active Senior), Gavin Kugler (Active Junior) and Gil Rhodes (Active Cadet).

The club ran it's third Open IRB carnival and the seas were again very rough on Main, so it was transferred to Home Beach. One weekend we will crack the perfect weather on Main Beach.

Patrols were rostered to Cylinder Beach for extended hours.

On the financial side of things we spent another \$60,000 outfitting the new extension on top of the first aid room and gear shed. This brought the project total to just under \$150,000 – all from our savings account. The September house to house collection raised \$10,400.



Roy Store and John Clark started a massive fundraising campaign raising \$21,000 to buy a new surf boat, a second hand training boat, two sets of oars, a trailer and funded a trip to Perth for the Junior team to compete at the Aussie titles.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (Qld). The Committee has determined that the Association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Plant and Equipment

Plant and equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the remaining life of the lease.

(b) Income Tax

The Association is a not for profit which is exempt from Income Tax .

(c) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

(d) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the entity reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

(e) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

(f) Revenue and Other Income

Grant income

When the Association receives grant income, it assesses whether the contract is enforceable and has sufficiently specific performance obligations in accordance with AASB 15. When both conditions are satisfied, the Association:

- Identifies each performance obligation relating to the grant;
- Recognises a contract liability for its obligations under the agreement; and
- Recognises revenue as it satisfies its performance obligations. If the contract is not enforceable or does not have sufficiently specific performance obligations, the Association recognises income immediately in the profit and loss

Annual membership subscriptions are recorded as revenue in the financial year that they relate to.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(h) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

(j) Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

(k) Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

Qualification

Accordingly, as the evidence available to me regarding fundraising revenue was limited, my audit procedures with respect to cash receipts had to be restricted to the amounts recorded in the financial records. I am therefore unable to express an opinion whether cash receipts the Club recorded are complete.

In addition, I did not attend the stocktake held. Accordingly, I am unable to express an opinion on the completeness and valuation of ending inventory as at 30 April 2022.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

Basis for Opinion

I have conducted my audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards.
